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
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NEW YEAR GOALS


As you make your goals for the New Year, let Jesus guide them for He knows all things. Write in the spaces below some goals that you would like to achieve as God guides your life.

UNIT OVERVIEW

JANUARY 2024 Choosing to Do Right




The Unit shows different situations in which we need to choose to do right. Boys and girls are often tempted to do wrong instead of doing what is pleasing to God. Sometimes, it is difficult to say "No", but it is always best to make the right choice.

Disobedience to God is a sin and the consequences of disobedience are sometimes very painful. In one lesson, the consequence was the death of a husband and his wife.

Can you identify with the story in the picture below? In what way? Write your response on the lines provided. Then, colour the picture.





Have you ever been tempted? Sometimes when we hear the word, "temptation" we might ignore it because we have heard it before and have become familiar with it. Jesus taught us not to give in to temptation.

When you are tempted, you are attracted or influenced to do something wrong. Can you imagine the devil tempting Jesus? Yes, even Jesus was tempted by Satan, the devil.

Just after Jesus was baptised in the Jordan River, the Holy Spirit led Him into a wilderness. The Holy Spirit was strengthening Him for His earthly mission. Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness. During those 40 days, Jesus did not eat anything and so He became very hungry.

While in the wilderness, Jesus was tempted by the devil. The

devil tried to get Jesus to give in or yield to his temptations. Jesus resisted and did not do what the devil asked Him to do.

The devil's first temptation was to get Jesus to turn stones into bread so that He could eat it. Jesus resisted the devil. He said: "It is written: 'Man shall not live on bread alone'" (Luke 4: 4 NIV).

When the devil saw that he had failed, he led Jesus up to a high place. They could see all the kingdoms of the world. The devil told Jesus that all those kingdoms belonged to him, the devil.

The devil said that he could give the kingdoms to anyone he chose. He promised to give them to Jesus if only Jesus would worship him. Jesus, again, quoted the Scriptures: "It is written: 'Worship the Lord your God, and serve Him only'" (v. 8 NIV). Obeying

God was more important to Jesus than having things.

The devil had failed twice but he persisted in his temptation of Jesus. This time, he took Jesus to the Temple in Jerusalem. He went to the highest point and challenged Jesus to jump off.

The devil tried to imitate Jesus by quoting Scripture. He reminded Jesus that Scripture said that if Jesus should jump off the Temple, God would command God's angels to protect Jesus and prevent Him from getting hurt.

Jesus responded to the devil as He did the first two times. He quoted Scripture: "Do not put the Lord your God to the test" (v. 12 NIV). The devil realised that he could not get Jesus to do anything wrong so he gave up and left Jesus alone. Like Jesus, we must resist any temptation to do wrong.

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

Kelly is always fighting Carla because Carla is quiet and smaller than Kelly. Carla is tired of being bullied by Kelly, so she decides to put an end to the bullying and defend herself. Carla plans to take a knife to school to stop Kelly from bullying her. Carla tells you about her plans.

Stephen was a servant of Jesus Christ. He had the Holy Spirit within him. That means, he was controlled by God's power. Things that seem difficult for us to do, like speaking boldly about Jesus and being kind to our enemies, are possible when the Holy Spirit lives in our heart and controls us.

God was using Stephen in a special way to allow people to see His power. Some enemies of Jesus began to quarrel with Stephen. The Holy Spirit inspired Stephen and he was able to answer the men who were against him. Those were members of the Sanhedrin, a group of people who were powerful leaders at the time. They had no solid argument against Stephen. Since they lost their argument with Stephen, they came up with a plan to try to get

Stephen in trouble. They bribed men to say they had heard Stephen speaking bad things about God, about their sacred Temple and about the law of Moses. They knew that if people believed their lies, Stephen would be in big trouble.

Soon, everybody including the teachers of the law believed the lies. They arrested Stephen. During Stephen's trial, the judges noticed that his face looked honest and pure; yet, they became angry with him.

While they were grinding their teeth in anger, Stephen was looking up to heaven. He told them: "I see heaven open and the Son of Man standing at the right hand of God" (Acts 7:56 NIV). Stephen did not allow fear of those angry men to prevent him from honouring Jesus by doing right.

The men were very angry that Stephen had not given in to what they wanted. They rushed toward him, grabbed him and dragged him out of the city. The people let a man named Saul, hold their cloaks while they stoned Stephen to death.

Can you imagine all the pain Stephen felt? But he did not even try to escape. Instead, he prayed, "Lord Jesus, receive my spirit." (vv. 59 NIV), and then, he knelt down and

even asked God not to blame the people for what they did. After he said that, he died.

Stephen preferred to be killed than to deny Jesus. He stood firm about his belief in Christ. God was pleased because Stephen did not give in to what he knew would displease God.

Stephen is recognised and honoured as one of the first Christian martyrs.
