When the people saw that King David and all the leaders gave things to Solomon to build God's big church, they praised God. David praised God, too. He said, "Praise the LORD who lives forever!"


We, too, should give willingly at church. God is pleased when we give at church.


It took seven years to build the new temple. God was pleased that the people had worked together to build Him a big, beautiful church.
